

Scissor Lift

Used Scissor Lift Sunnyvale - Scissor lifts are industrial machines that rely on a configuration of crisscrossed linked steel arms. Scissor lifts create an “X” support network to facilitate vertical lifting. The scissor lift has a rectangular platform attached to the top of it. There are secure support railings along the platform edge for extra safety and to keep the operator safe. The scissor lift has a low profile to maintain stability on hard, compact surfaces like concrete. These units can run on either a combustion engine or electric engine to handle the lifting and transporting of the machine. Since the scissor lift functions on a vertical plane, if it needs to be repositioned horizontally, the operator will have to move it into place. Rough terrain and regular lift models rely on the same lifting technology to maneuver the lifting components. The rough terrain units are designed for driving on gravel and uneven surfaces. Higher ground clearance and oversized all-terrain tires enable these machines to travel to tricky locations. Certain models offer 4WD making them able to traverse through dirty areas. The higher center of gravity works in conjunction with lower lifting heights. If you have never operated one before, scissor lifts can seem strange or intimidating. While you may think this machine is susceptible to swaying in the wind or becoming unbalanced, understand that it has been designed to ensure total operator safety and that likely, you will not even feel the machine moving. A variety of safety tests have to be completed before this unit can be sold. Of course, if you are new to this kind of equipment, it is normal to feel unsure until you familiarize yourself with the unit. It is essential to maintain safety precautions all of the time. Understanding what you will be using your scissor lift for will help ensure you have the right type of model. The scissor lift model you will need will largely depend on the types of jobs you will need to do. Key factors to consider include how high you will need to reach and the types of loads you will be moving. There are different models on the market that can help you reach various heights. Compact units are often used for interior locations including factories, warehouses or freight locations. There is no need to purchase the largest model on the market if you are not going to require the fullest capacity. Electric scissor lifts have optional platforms and railings to offer maximum safety features. Scissor lifts are reliable and safe for a multitude of applications. If these machines did not follow strict safety rules and particular inspections, they would not be for sale across the globe. Scissor lifts help people accomplish tasks that are otherwise unattainable, unreachable or inaccessible. As these machines vertically elevate, the machine is transported into the correct location before lifting occurs. The operator needs to move the unit into the correct position before engaging the lift. Numerous safety features have been designed into the machine. Following operational guidelines is essential for everyone’s safety. There is a safe basket workspace on scissor lifts to ensure lifting tasks are more secure as opposed to hanging off of scaffolding or a ladder. The majority of scissor lifts utilize batteries that are internally mounted inside of the base of the lift to generate power. After working an extensive shift or for prolonged periods of time, charging is necessary. Batteries may be changed every 12 hours or charged many times throughout the day. To charge the scissor lift, the operator parks it close to an electrical outlet within a well-ventilated location. The emergency shut-off switch is engaged upon parking to prevent other operators from driving off while plugged in. The large red button found inside the lift or the basket, close to the charger or the control box is the emergency shut-off switch. Oftentimes, the battery charger is found on the right side of the lift on the base of the machine. Older scissor lifts may have a battery charger found on the back of the unit. The scissor lift charger is plugged into the AC extension cord into a well-ventilated location. Next, the extension cord plugs into an electrical outlet. The electrical cord length on the battery charger has to be short for safety reasons to prevent the unit from running over it. There is a high possibility of danger if the extension cord dropped out of the battery charger while the machine is in operation. After the scissor lift plugs in to charge, all of the lights should become lit up. After the scissor lift is plugged in the machine’s batteries begin to charge. The battery lights will switch to green once complete charging has occurred and the charger will shut off. Older scissor lift models rely on a meter

to show whether zero volts have been attained after complete charging has occurred. This type of charger automatically shuts down as well once charging is done. After the scissor lift is completely charged, the unit is ready to get back to work. It is common for warehouses and certain businesses to keep batteries charging around the clock to allow the scissor lift to operate 24 hours a day.
